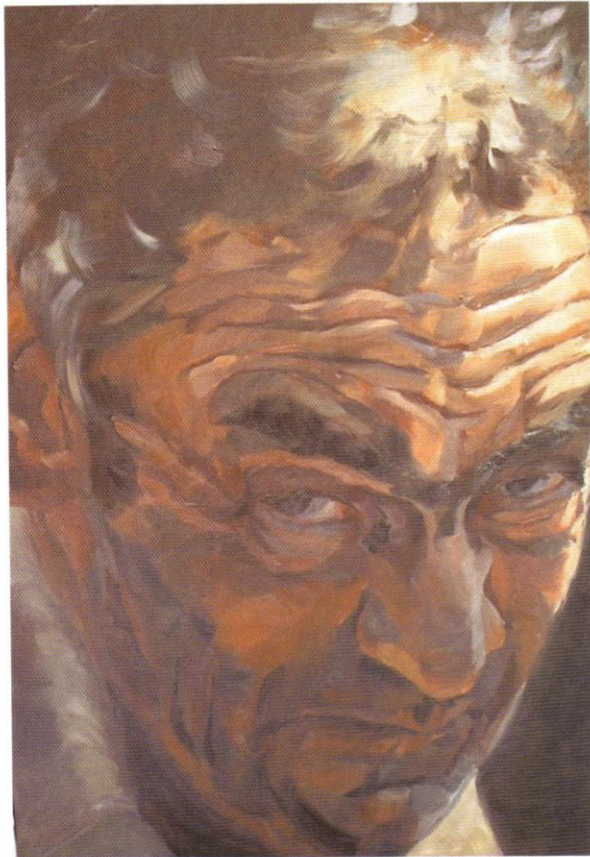


STUDENTS WIN MAJOR PRIZES
